






FEDERAL FUNDING SOURCES AT RISK¹










Local Meals on Wheels programs operate autonomously and therefore federal funding percentages vary from program to program. Programs rely on additional funding from a mix of state and local resources, as well as private donations from corporations, foundations and/or individuals.

CUTS WOULD FORCE MEALS ON WHEELS PROGRAMS TO MAKE VERY TOUGH CHOICES

If funding is cut, local Meals on Wheels programs report having to do one or more of the following:

- ✓ Reduce number of meals served
- Reduce number of days meals are served
- ✓ Reduce staff hours or draw on reserves
- ✓ Limit participation in and/or close congregate meal sites
- ✓ Establish or add to a waiting list
- ✓ Eliminate weekend/holiday meals
- ✓ Eliminate special diets and preferences
- ✓ Shut program down altogether

REDUCTIONS IN FEDERAL FUNDING WOULD ONLY MAKE
MATTERS WORSE AS THE DEMAND FOR MEALS ON WHEELS
