House of Representatives

In the House, the Speaker serves as the top leader who is elected by the whole House of Representatives for a two-year term. The Speaker has several combined roles, including the responsibility of presiding over legislative business, serving as the leader of the majority party and as an elected member

representing their own congressional district. The Speaker, with support from party leadership, determines which pieces of legislation will be considered and debated by the full House.
