


The Crisis of Waitlists for Meals on Wheels



Imagine waiting months — even years — for nutritious meals and moments of connection. That's the heartbreaking reality for too many older adults across the country. As America's senior population grows, the need is outpacing the capacity of local

Meals on Wheels providers — and the result is a national crisis of waitlists. Providers are working tirelessly to stretch limited resources and serve more seniors, but they can't do it alone. Without sustainable funding, the wait will only grow longer.

**1 in 3** providers has a waitlist.



Nearly 46,000 seniors are waiting — almost enough people to fill Yankee Stadium.



The average waitlist is 187 seniors, some exceed 5,000.



The average wait is 4 months. some wait more than 2 years.

The challenge of addressing waitlists is complex, and can vary not only by provider but also region. **Nearly 2/3 of providers with waitlists serve rural areas**.

Waitlists are largest in: **TX, FL, GA, NC** and **SC**. Most of these states also experience heightened rates of senior food insecurity.

Unfortunately, some providers have **stopped adding seniors to their waitlists** because of the already overwhelming demand. Tragically, some seniors pass away or move into nursing homes before ever receiving services.







# What Is Causing the Waitlist Crisis?

**#1 REASON: FUNDING SHORTFALLS** 



**Federal funding has not kept pace** with the growing senior population.



Private dollars are shrinking.



Food, fuel, labor and utility **costs** are rising.

### PROVIDERS ALSO FACE ...



Staffing and volunteer **shortages**.



**Outdated or maxed-out** kitchens and delivery equipment.

The number of providers with waitlists may soon increase by nearly half due to lack of resources.

## What It Takes to End the Wait

#### PROVIDERS NEED...

- **Sustainable funding** to invest in infrastructure and expand capacity to meet rising demand.
- Nearly \$600,000 per provider on average to eliminate waitlists in the next year. For some providers with large waitlists, it can be up to \$7 million.
- **\$67 million** across 115 providers to end their waitlists for a year.
- **Top needs**: meal costs, staff, vehicles, kitchen space.

With the right funding, Meals on Wheels providers can show up for older adults in every corner of the country to deliver nutritious meals and moments of connection. Every dollar moves us closer to a future where no senior has to wait for the support they deserve.
